## Introduction to Oil Painting with Bruce St. Clair

## **MATERIALS LIST**

- Note: Water-soluble oils are also good for this course no solvents. Suggestion: Less expensive to buy a set than individual tubes
- Suggested Colours:
  - Alizarin Crimson
  - o Cadmium Red, medium or light
  - Cadmium Yellow, med.
  - Lemon Yellow
  - o Viridian and/or Hooker's Green
  - Thalo Blue
  - Ultramarine Blue
  - Ivory or Carbon Black (optional)
  - o Titanium White
  - Burnt Umber
  - o Burnt Sienna
  - o Yellow Ochre a/o Raw Sienna
- Brushes: a variety of synthetic oil/acrylic and bristle brushes including:
  - o Filberts, #1-4, useful for a variety of brushstrokes (\$ store may carry sets)
  - Square flats, from small to large (for broader areas) (\$ store may carry sets)
  - o Round oil/acrylic brush, # 2
  - o Small, pointed watercolour or acrylic brush (no bigger than #3) for detail
- Other Supplies:
  - o Odourless mineral spirits or substitute solvent. Toxic turpentine is not an option
  - Linseed oil, poppy oil a/o an alkyd medium, such as Liquin, which speeds drying
  - Painting medium (can be mixed from equal parts solvent + oil; combine in small glass jar)
  - Paper palette, white or gray-toned
  - Small painting ('palette') knife (1"-1 1/2") for mixing colours and painting (check \$ stores)
  - Canvas boards (\$ store) are good for starters, then stretched canvas or gessoed
    Masonite
  - Old telephone book for brush cleaning
